### About the Authors

*Scott O. Lilienfeld* is an associate professor in the Department of Psychology at Emory University in Atlanta. He received his Ph.D. in Psychology (Clinical) from the University of Minnesota in 1990. His primary research interests include the etiology and assessment of personality disorders (e.g., psychopathic personality) and personality traits, conceptual issues in psychiatric classification and diagnosis, and the etiology of anxiety disorders. He is on the editorial boards of several journals, including *Psychological Assessment*, *Journal of Abnormal Psychology*, and *Clinical Psychology: Science and Practice*, and he is a consulting editor for *Skeptical Inquirer* magazine. He was the recipient of the 1998 David Shakow Award for Early Career Contributions to Clinical Psychology from Division 12 (Clinical Psychology) of the American Psychological Association.

He received his Ph.D. in Psychology from the University of Arizona in 1990, with a major in clinical psychology and a minor in methodology and statistics.
